6.0 Business Arising from the Minutes

6.1 By-law changes – Update

Article 11.1 – Any person who is aware that a certified MLT member has engaged in conduct detrimental to the MAMLS Association/Society (MAMLS/CSMLS) or to the profession of medical laboratory technology will be referred to the Registrar of the College of Medical Laboratory Technologists of Manitoba (CMLTM) to file a formal written complaint. The Registrar will determine whether an investigation and/or disciplinary action are required.

Article 11.2 – Any person who is aware that a MLA certified member has engaged in conduct detrimental to the Association or to the profession, of medical laboratory science or has violated the Code of Professional Conduct of the CSMLS or the Standards of Practice of the MAMLS may file a written complaint with the CEO of the CSMLS. Upon receipt of the written complaint, the Executive Director of CSMLS shall act upon that complaint in accordance with CSMLS Bylaws.

No motions will be made on Article 11.1 and 11.2. It was determined by the Board of Directors that no changes were required as these articles are in place to protect the public. An opportunity for members to raise their concerns were provided.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> In regards to Article 11.2, Trish Van Denakker commented that MAMLS should have a disciplinary process for MAMLS members that are not members of CSMLS. It was stated that CSMLS may have regulations in place for MLA's in the future and that MAMLS do not have the resources to sustain a disciplinary process as MAMLS are an advocacy group. MAMLS proposed that action, (such as removing MAMLS membership status) may be taken for any disciplinary issues regarding the actions of an MLA. Further discussion amongst the Board of Directors regarding this question will be required.

7.0 Presentation of Awards

- 7.2 Crocus Award Virginia Leifso was presented this award for her contributions to the field of Medical Laboratory Science
