Still reeling from burnout due to the pandemic, we withstood understaffed workplaces, changes in responsibilities, union negotiations and strikes. However, once again, our passion and drive for our profession never faltered, and together our commitment to our patients persisted.

This year, the MAMLS Board was able to put on many of our favorite events again, and we attended several activities to advocate for our beloved profession.

EVENTANDADVOCACY HIGHLIGHTS

- MAMLS participated as judges for the Manitoba Schools Science Symposium and helped promote lab professions to students.
- A meeting was held with Roche's Provincial Healthcare Leader of Manitoba to discuss how Roche can assist in bringing light to the hard work and impact of Medical Laboratory Professionals.
- As part of the transition of health professions under the Regulated Health Professions Act,
 MAMLS met with CMLTM and Manitoba Health for discussion and to provide feedback on their proposed Reserved Acts.
- MAMLS President attended CSMLS's Council on Government and Public Relations in September, where we discussed issues facing the industry on a national level. Noteworthy topics included pursuing financial assistance and loan forgiveness for Medical Laboratory programs, expansion and innovation for lab professional training, and further research to support mental health in our workplaces.



 On November 4th, MAMLS held its Annual General Meeting at Canad Inns Club Regent in Winnipeg, and in-person and virtual event, including 2 CE Sessions by Clinical Genetic Counsellor Jessica Lawrence, and Quality and Development Technologist, Denise Fudge.

MAMLS DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- The Finance committee continued to transition our records into Quickbooks under the direction of the Auditors.
- MAMLS voting rules were reviewed, and new voting cards were created and laminated for ease of use and longevity.
- MAMLS logos were reformatted for better resolution.
- Forms and documents were reviewed and updated for use on the website
- Discussions were held to update and modernize the By-Laws and Standing Rules.
