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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The year 2020 was a very challenging year for all laboratory professionals. It was a year of overwhelming diagnostic testing for Covid-19 the first and second during waves. implementation of innovative training techniques, and increased national



awareness of the medical laboratory profession. Although this created many obstacles for MAMLS to fulfill its mandates, the Board actively pursued ways to advocate and promote the profession to support its members.

This year:

- MAMLS welcomed the new Board members: Maggie MacFarlane as Treasurer, Angela Bueckert as the MLA Representative, and Virginia Leifso rejoined us in the newly created position of Northern Manitoba Representative. Lorenne Friesen was also welcomed as the newly elected President of Valley Plains Academy.
- LABCON 2020 in Winnipeg was cancelled due to Covid restrictions, but members were able to attend LabConnect, a virtual continuing education opportunity hosted by CSMLS for a minimal cost.
- Other events normally attended or sponsored by MAMLS and the Academies were cancelled: Rotary Career Symposium, PWA/Shared Health Symposium, Manitoba School Science Symposium, National Med Lab Week activities, MCMLS Congress, Red River College graduation ceremony & awards, and Valley Plains CE Dinner Event.
